

URBAN STUDIES TRANSFER ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

May 27, 1999

KENTUCKY COMMUNITY COLLEGE SYSTEM, ASSOCIATE OF ARTS IN PRE-URBAN PROFESSIONS, AND UNIVERSITY OF CINCINNATI, SCHOOL OF PLANNING, COLLEGE OF DESIGN, ART, ARCHITECTURE AND PLANNING, BACHELORS OF URBAN STUDIES

INTRODUCTION: This agreement details the transferability of courses from the Associate of Arts (AA) Degree in Pre-Urban Professions at the Kentucky Community College System to the Bachelors of Science in Urban Studies Program at the School of Planning (SOP), College of Design, Architecture, Art and Planning (DAAP), University of Cincinnati.


ARTICULATION OVERVIEW: A Transfer Framework table is attached which details how courses in the Kentucky Community College System's Associate of Arts degree program in Pre-Urban Professions will transfer to the College of Design, Architecture, Art and Planning, School of Planning. Students from Kentucky Community College System completing the A.A. Degree in Pre-Urban Professions will be guaranteed admission under the conditions outlined below at the junior level to the College of DAAP to pursue the Bachelor of Urban Studies. Students who (1) meet these admissions requirements, (2) take the courses prescribed in the DAAP Bulletin, and (3) make satisfactory academic progress as defined in the DAAP Undergraduate Student Handbook, can expect to graduate at the end of two years of further study.

ADMISSION INTO THE COLLEGE OF DESIGN, ARCHITECTURE, ART AND PLANNING: Kentucky Community College System students are guaranteed admission into the Bachelor of Urban Studies Program within certain enrollment limits if they complete the Associate of Arts Degree in Pre-Urban Professions at Kentucky Community College System.


Enrollment Limits: The School of Planning enrollment is limited to a number of transfer students, which will be determined annually by August 1 of the preceding academic year. Students will be admitted on a first come first served basis. Kentucky Community College System students should apply to the Urban Studies Program by December 15, of their sophomore year for admission autumn quarter of the following year. After the annual enrollment target is met further applicants can not be guaranteed admission, but will be considered in the normal applicant pool for that year. However, students may be admitted under the articulation agreement in other quarters depending on available space. Students who have not earned the A.A. degree who wishes to transfer must have a cumulative grade point average for all college-level work of 2.6.

In accordance with the Ohio Board of Regents Articulation and Transfer Policy and the Kentucky Council on Postsecondary Education General Education Transfer Policy all students who have completed a Kentucky Community College System Associate Degree as outlined in the attached Kentucky Transfer Framework will receive transfer credit for all college level courses that have been completed with a passing grade.

DURATION OF AGREEMENT: Initially, this agreement is effective from its signing in the spring of 1999 through October 1, 2002. Starting Autumn Session of the year 2000, this agreement will be reviewed annually and will be extended for two years, unless either of the parties requests that it be changed. Any changes in articulation will be mutually agreed to in writing and will be made before February 1 preceding the academic year of implementation so they may be included in the college's bulletin. Any changes will take effect two years from the date of the announcement of the change and will not affect students currently covered by the agreement unless mutually agreed to by both colleges.
