INTRODUCTION:

This agreement details the transferability of courses from the Associate of Arts (AA) Degree in Pre-Urban Professions at University of Cincinnati Clermont College to the Planning Accreditation Board (PAB) Accredited Bachelors of Urban Planning five-year Professional Practice Program at the School of Planning (SOP), College of Design, Architecture, Art and Planning (DAAP), University of Cincinnati.

ARTICULATION OVERVIEW:

A course equivalency table is attached which details how courses in the UC Clermont College's Associate of Arts degree program in Pre-Urban Professions will transfer to the College of Design, Architecture, Art and Planning, School of Planning. Students from UC Clermont College completing the A.A. Degree in Pre-Urban Professions will be guaranteed admission under the conditions outlined below at the pre-junior (third-year) level to the College of DAAP to pursue the Bachelor of Urban Planning. Students who (1) meet these admissions requirements, (2) take the courses prescribed in the DAAP Bulletin, and (3) make satisfactory academic progress as defined in the DAAP Undergraduate Student Handbook, can expect to graduate at the end of three full years of further study.

**ADMISSION INTO THE COLLEGE OF DESIGN, ARCHITECTURE, ART AND
PLANNING:**


UC Clermont College students are guaranteed admission into the Bachelor of Urban Planning Program within certain enrollment limits if they complete the Associate of Arts Degree in Pre-Urban Planning Professions at UC Clermont College.

ENROLLMENT LIMITS: The School of Planning enrollment is limited to a number of transfer students which will be determined annually by August 1 of the preceding academic year. Students will be admitted on a first come first served basis. UC Clermont College students should apply to the Urban Planning Program during autumn quarter of their sophomore year for admission autumn quarter of the following year. After the annual enrollment target is met, further applicants can not be guaranteed admission, but will be considered in the normal applicant pool for that year. However, students may be admitted under the articulation agreement in other quarters depending on available space. Students who have not earned the A.A. degree who wishes to transfer must have a cumulative grade point average for all college-level work of 2.6.


In accordance with the Ohio Board of Regents Articulation and Transfer Policy, all students who have completed a UC Clermont College Associate Degree will receive transfer credit for all college level courses that have been completed with a passing grade.

DURATION OF AGREEMENT:


Initially, this agreement is effective from its signing in the spring of 1999 through October 1, 2002. Starting Autumn Session of the year 2000, this agreement will be reviewed annually and will be extended for two years, unless either of the parties requests that it be changed. Any changes in articulation will be mutually agreed to in writing and will be made before February 1 preceding the academic year of implementation so they may be included in the college's bulletin. Any changes will take effect two years from the date of the announcement of the change and will not affect students currently covered by the agreement unless mutually agreed to by both colleges.





This Articulation Agreements attests that the named programs\colleges define and uphold those conditions specified herein for the time period identified. These programs\colleges further agree to review this Agreement, and to reaffirm, revise, or terminate it as necessary, in order to continue to serve the interests of their students and faculties.

The Agreement governs the matriculation of students at **Clermont College** who transfer into **College of Business Administration** upon completion of their Associate Degree according to the attached curriculum outline.

The parties to this Agreement will arrange annual articulation meeting to review course content and equivalences. This Agreement seeks to encourage completion of the Associate Degree. All other variables being equal, priority will be given to UC transfer students who have completed their Associate Degree. This Agreement acknowledges University policy that possession of the Associate Degree from a UC access college negates any and all minimum enrollment deficiencies that a student might have had at high school level. This Agreement also acknowledges University policy with regard to acceptance of "D" grades; if "D" grades are accepted by the baccalaureate program\college, the "D" grades will be applied to meet degree requirements when transferred from Associate Degree programs, as well. During the period of this Agreement, each program\college pledges to keep the other informed as program changes affecting this Agreement may occur.

FOOTNOTES

- 1 Placement test required prior to enrollment. Preparatory English (English 100) and/or Freshman English Exit Exam Remediation (English 099) will not transfer and will not apply toward an associate degree.
- 2 Placement test required prior to enrollment. Many students may need preparatory math before enrolling in College Algebra. Math 114 and/or 131 or 132, 133 will not transfer to the UC College of Business Administration and do not apply to the Associate of Arts degree. College Algebra (025-176 or 173,174) will transfer as 3 credits of non-business electives. Consult an advisor concerning course pre-requisites if additional preparatory math is needed. Students not needing College Algebra should take a 3 credit hour history elective.
- 3 Students who wish to take a slower paced sequence may substitute Accounting I, II, III. However, the additional hours will not transfer except possibly for those in the Accounting Focus Concentration.
- 4 Matriculated students must schedule a yearly meeting with the adviser to certify progress toward graduation. This does not replace quarterly scheduling meetings with their advisers.
- 5 Students expecting to co-op in the Junior year must take Professional Development (000-171) in the Sophomore year.
- 6 Electives should be selected from Clermont College's General Education Approved Course List (available in the Student Development Office).
- 7 Select History electives from area 075 such as American History (075-110,111,112) or History of Western Civilization (075-101,102,103).
- 8 Select Natural Science electives from biology (047), chemistry (035), physics (030), geology (040), or physical geography (041), (Regional Geography (041-121) is not a Natural Science and will not transfer. Information Systems concentration students must fulfill this requirement with C Language and Advanced C Language (445-261, 262) and a humanities elective (literature or from areas 060, 065 or 370).
- 9 Students electing the Foreign Language Option will replace 9 hours of natural science and 6 hours of history electives with 15 hours of foreign language. (The history and natural science electives will be taken in the Junior or Senior year.)
- 10 Choose from Humanities electives: Major American Writers I, II, III (001-207, 208, 209); Major British Writers I, II, III (001-231, 232, 233); Introduction to Modern Philosophy (065-171); Contemporary Moral Issues (065-182).
- 11 Students who do not have typing speed of 20 wpm must take Keyboarding (413-171) concurrently.
