First-Year Admission Guidelines

First-year applicants are holistically reviewed for direct-admission into the four-year BSN program. Common Application and supporting documents need to be submitted by Dec. 1.

- Minimum high school GPA 3.0
- Recommended minimum 23 ACT/1070 SAT

Some applicants will be invited to join Multiple Mini Interviews so we can better assess their fit with our program.

Sophomore Admission Guidelines

Sophomore-year applicants are encouraged to meet with a College of Nursing advisor. Once admitted, students will complete three years of the nursing core curriculum and graduate in a total of four years.

Minimum requirements are:

- Completion of the BSN application between Feb. 1-28 (nursing.uc.edu)
- In-person essay and pre-admission exam
- Completion (C or higher) of the first-year nursing curriculum by May 15 of the application year
